

Pupils explore new facilities

'Modern' building open to visitors

Students and parents will have a chance to explore new facilities at an open evening at a Forest Gate school.

The state-of-the-art building at Stratford School Academy in Grosvenor Road opened at the beginning of September after their move from Upton Lane. The facilities were built as part of a government funding programme and include a new building with a modern design and lots of light, more windows in classrooms, a lift and a furnished canteen.

The open evening on September 30 will be the first glimpse of the new building for Year 6 students and their parents.

It will also give them a chance to meet staff, hear a speech from the headteacher, and get a feel for what

life is like at the school.

The old building in Upton Lane is being re-built to provide a second self-contained fifth form block.

Headteacher Andrew Seager said: "We are really pleased to be into the first of our two new buildings.

"If we are going to be as successful in the future as we have been in the past we need new, modern buildings with up-to-date facilities.

"It's the least our pupils deserve and important in attracting the best teachers."

The open evening at Stratford School Academy will take place from 4pm to 7pm on September 30.
