Handwriting: Remember, if an examiner cannot read your answer they cannot award you the marks. During your PPEs, pay particular attention to your handwriting if you know that your handwriting deteriorates in an exam.

Tips to improve your handwriting from an examiner:

- The **quality of your pen** will make a big difference to your handwriting. Try a variety of different pens when revising and choose one that is comfortable to write with for over an hour (some of your exams are 2 hours in length!)
- Small writing is the hardest to read, if your writing is usually small try to make it **bigger**.
- Make sure you write in **black ink** – your actual GCSE paper will be scanned when sent to the examiner. Blue ink or pencil will make it much harder to read when scanned.
